The University of Massachusetts is a five-campus public research university system renowned for the quality of its academic programs, the scope and excellence of its research, and the strength of its public service mission. UMass provides access to high-quality, affordable education that advances knowledge and improves the lives of the people of the Commonwealth, the nation and the world.

UMass Amherst, founded in 1863, is the flagship of the five-campus UMass system. Home to the Commonwealth Honors College, UMass Amherst incorporates modern teaching methods involving new communication and information technology, yet remains an immersive, residential campus offering students a comprehensive array of academic programs. True to its land-grant roots, UMass Amherst is engaged in research and creative work in all fields and is classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as a doctoral university with the "highest research activity" or R1. Major areas of emphasis include climate science, food science, alternative energy, nanomanufacturing, polymer science, computer science and linguistics. Consistently rated as a "Top Producer of Fulbright Students," UMass Amherst is ranked 29th among the nation's top public universities by *U.S. News & World Report*.

UMass Boston is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban public universities. Located on Boston Harbor, it is the metropolitan area's only public research university. UMass Boston's distinguished intellectual contributions span the social sciences, education, health and wellness, and — increasingly — the physical and life sciences, with faculty earning international recognition in biology; environmental, earth, and ocean sciences; cancer research; physics and chemistry. UMass Boston's exceptionally diverse student body represents 150 countries. UMass Boston is committed to educating people from modest-income backgrounds, first-generation college students, and those from urban areas both here and abroad.

UMass Dartmouth is a Tier 1 national research university that is dedicated to engaged learning and innovative research resulting in lifelong student success. Located on 710 acres on the South Coast of Massachusetts, UMass Dartmouth is home to a \$27 million research enterprise and is the only Massachusetts research university located south of Boston. Its civic engagement program generates more than 230,000 hours of student community service each year and places the university in the top 1 percent nationwide on the President's National Community Service Honor Roll. UMass Dartmouth offers students high-quality academic programs through 50 majors and 40 professional and doctoral programs, including the UMass School of Law, the state's only public law school.

UMass Lowell is the fifth-fastest growing public doctoral university in the country, according to the Chronicle of Higher Education. Since 2007, UMass Lowell has achieved significant enrollment growth while simultaneously increasing the academic qualifications and diversity of its student body. National recognition of the campus is on the rise. *U.S. News & World Report* ranks UMass Lowell No.156 in its National Universities Rankings. UMass Lowell programs support workforce and economic development through innovative research, business incubation and public-private partnerships. The university prepares students to take the world in their hands by emphasizing experiential learning through cooperative education, public service and applied research. This translates into earning potential. UMass Lowell produces the highest average 20-year return on investment among all public research universities in New England, according to PayScale.

UMass Medical School (UMMS), founded in 1962 and located in Worcester, with its first-ever regional campus in partnership with Baystate Health in Springfield, is the Commonwealth's only public medical school and serves as the university's Nobel Prize-winning health sciences campus. Perennially ranked in the top 10 percent for primary care training, UMMS has remained true to its founding mission while also becoming globally recognized in biomedical research. UMMS has three graduate schools — School of Medicine, Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, and Graduate School of Nursing. Unique among all medical schools, UMMS is also home to Commonwealth Medicine, a health care consulting division that partners with Massachusetts and other states in delivering health services to vulnerable populations, and MassBiologics, the only non-profit, FDA-licensed vaccine manufacturer in the nation.

UMassOnline is the University of Massachusetts' nationally acclaimed online education consortium that features more than 1,500 online courses and 160 online certificate and degree programs from the five UMass campuses. Since its founding in 2001, UMassOnline has continued to grow, with 75,565 course enrollments in FY17 across the five campuses. Online students can pursue an associate, bachelor's, master's or doctoral degree in a variety of in-demand subject areas, including liberal arts, education, management, nursing, public health and information technology. Online students learn from the same world-class instructors as students who study on campus, and they receive an identical degree. UMassOnline programs consistently earn high rankings in *U.S. News & World Report* and GetEducated.com.
