With **75,000** students and more than **18,000** graduates every year, UMass is the **largest producer of the highly skilled workers** in Massachusetts.

UMass is **3rd largest research university in Massachusetts** and **4th largest research university in New England**, behind only Harvard, MIT and Yale with \$687 million in annual research and development.

For the **6th** consecutive year, every UMass campus has achieved **national ranking by U.S. News & World Report**.

UMass is ranked **60th** among all U.S. institutions and **30th** among all U.S. public universities in the **2021 Times Higher Education World University Rankings**.

UMass faculty include a **Nobel laureate**, **Pulitzer Prize** winners, **National Academy of Sciences** members, an **American Book Award** winner and **Fulbright, Guggenheim, MacArthur** and **Mellon Fellows**.

There are **more than 500,000 UMass alumni** around the world, including **more than 300,000** living, working and leading companies and organizations throughout Massachusetts.
