## MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Tuesday, June 20, 2017; 12:00 p.m.

Chair Manning convened the meeting at 12:09 p.m. and stated that due to uncertainty regarding the state's FY18 revenue projections and the ongoing negotiations of the Budget Conference Committee that will affect the University's budget appropriation, a decision was made to defer action on tuition and fees for the undergraduate campuses to a Board meeting in July.

#### **Reports:**

#### Chair's Report

Chair Manning provided an overview of the day's agenda, noting that the Medical School would discuss its 5-year strategic plan, and the Board would vote on tuition and fees for the Medical School, on the Consent Agenda, and on the amended Capital plan.

Chair Manning acknowledged Chancellor Helm for his leadership on the Dartmouth campus. Chancellor Helm skillfully led the campus through its leadership transition at a turbulent time. He thanked Chancellor Helm for his contributions to the University of Massachusetts.

Chair Manning announced the establishment of the Governance Committee membership for 2017-2018. The Committee will meet over the summer and report back to the Board in September.

## **Student Trustee Report, UMass Dartmouth**

Trustee Delaney commented on his journey to the University of Massachusetts, noting the opportunities afforded to him as a student at UMass Dartmouth. He stated that coming to UMass was the best decision he could have made. He then provided highlights of his career as a student at UMass Dartmouth which included study in Portugal, leading service trips in Guatemala, and becoming a Commonwealth Honors Scholar.

Trustee Delaney commented on the importance of an education from the University of Massachusetts and noted that the students of the campus are children of immigrants and working-class individuals striving to achieve their version of the American Dream. He noted that UMass Dartmouth is in the top 22% of universities in the nation in the social mobility of its students and that the campus strives to uplift students and gives them a change to work and study on some of the most complex issues facing the nation.

Trustee Delaney asked the Board to support the UMass Dartmouth students, continue to be equal partners with the new Chancellor, and to give the campus and University system the attention and respect that they earned.

Chair Manning then acknowledged the outgoing student Trustees for their commitment and service as members of Board of Trustees. He announced that Trustee Reed from the Lowell campus was re-elected to the Board.

## President's Report

President Meehan congratulated and extended his best wishes to the outgoing student Trustees. He noted that the student Trustee role is a position of immense responsibility to undertake while pursuing a UMass degree full-time.

President Meehan congratulated the Class of 2017—the University's largest ever graduating class with approximately 17,700 graduates across the five campuses. In addition to what that milestone represents in terms of access and opportunity for students at UMass, it underscores the significance of the University's workforce contribution to the Commonwealth.

President Meehan commented on signing onto the "We Are Still In" pledge, which indicates that the University will continue to pursue its ambitious sustainability goals and remain actively engaged with the international community in an effort to combat climate change and accelerate the transition to a clean energy economy despite the United States' withdrawal from the Paris Climate Accord.

President Meehan commented on the FY18 budget progress and stated that it is in the best interests of the University to wait until there is a final budget from the Budget Conference Committee before acting on the FY18 budget and setting tuition and fees for the 2017-18 Academic Year.

#### **Discussion Item:**

Chair Manning reported that he requested that the Chancellors present their campus 5-year strategic plan to the Board. He stated that the Lowell, Amherst, and Medical School plans have been shared via Boardvantage and that the Boston and Dartmouth campuses will finalize their plans following their leadership transitions. The plans will be presented each board cycle beginning with the Medical School.

Chancellor Collins then presented the Medical School's strategic goals for 2015-2020. His strategic focus surrounds the education, research-basic, research-translational, and healthcare delivery. Chancellor Collins provided an overview of the 5-year financial plan and highlighted various initiatives that contribute to over a decade of accomplishments for the Medical School.

#### **Action item:**

Chair Manning reported that on June 7<sup>th</sup> the Committee on Academic and Student Affairs voted to recommend that the Board approve the University's Opposition to the Department of Higher Education's Draft Proposal for Revising its Academic Program Approval Process. He noted that since the Committee on Academic and Student Affairs meeting the Board of Higher Education postponed discussion and took no action at its Academic Affairs Committee meeting on June 13. He asked that President Meehan engage in dialogue with the Commissioner of Higher Education on the matter and provide an update of the status of those discussions.

President Meehan commented that productive discussions have been underway and the Department of Higher Education continues to engage in a review of how best to fulfill its statutory responsibilities for program approvals. President Meehan is confident that the University and the Department of Higher Education can work together to develop policies that will allow the faculty, the Board, and the Board of Higher Education to have a timely, appropriate, and responsible voice in future program approvals. He anticipates that the dialogue will continue and will provide an update in the fall.

Chair Manning then asked for a motion to approve the <u>University of Massachusetts</u>

Opposition to the Department of Higher Education's (DHE) Revised Procedures for New

Academic Program Proposals for Public Institutions of Higher Education in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

It was moved and seconded.
