Persons who are present in the U.S. in the following non-immigrant visa classifications are not eligible for in-state tuition under Massachusetts Tuition Equity Law.¹

K-1; K-2	 Fiancé and Spouse of U.S. Citizen: The fiancé of a U.S. citizen, who will enter a valid marriage with the U.S. citizen within ninety days after admission and their minor child. The spouse of a U.S. citizen who is the beneficiary of an immigrant petition filed by the USC spouse and their minor child.
L-1; L-2	Intracompany Transferee: Certain managers/executives or persons with specialized knowledge who work for multinational organizations and enter the U.S. to continue to render services to the same employer or a subsidiary or affiliate; and certain members of their immediate family.
M-1; M-2	<u>Vocational or Other Nonacademic Students</u> : Students pursuing a full course of study at an established vocational or other recognized nonacademic institution and certain members of their immediate family.
N	Certain Parents and Children of Special Immigrants: Parents of Special Immigrant under paragraph (27)(I)(i), but only if and while the alien is a child. Child of Special Immigrant under clause (ii), (iii), or (iv) of paragraph (27)(I).

R-1; R-2	Religious Workers: A member of a religious denomination having a bona fide nonprofit, religious organization in the U.S., who seeks to enter the U.S. to perform the certain enumerated work and certain members of their immediate family.
S	Witnesses and Informants: A witness and/or informant who is willing to supply/has supplied critical reliable information to law enforcement concerning a criminal or terrorist organization or enterprise, whose presence is essential to a criminal investigation or prosecution or would be placed in danger for providing such information, and certain members of their immediate family.
